WHEREAS, travel and expenses not in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.1 et seq but deemed by the Board of Education to be necessary and unavoidable are excluded from the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A: 23B-1.1 et seq;

WHEREAS, the Board had previously established maximum amount for the pre-budget year 2018-2019 as \$30,000; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has expended \$15,247 of the maximum amount for the pre-budget year to date; and

NOW THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board establishes a travel expenditure maximum for 2019-2020 not to exceed \$35,000, excluding federal sources. Be it further resolved that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum amount is not exceeded. Be it further resolved, included in this amount is a maximum of \$2,500 per employee or officer.

Mrs. VanBuren expressed her concern on the budget and the raising of the taxes, not to do it, as she is representing citizens that have asked not to raise taxes.

Ms. Montgomery, the chair of the Finance Committee said that Mr. Evcil is the most frugal when it comes to budgeting and has worked very hard on the budget to keep it low. Also that as parents of the community want security officers in schools, Care Plus for mental health services, increasing cost of benefits etc., and in order to keep this we cannot have one without the other.

Mrs. Kohles said that the parents want security officers and mental health.

Mr. Connors said that we can try to save money by start planning to bringing special education back to the district.

Mr. Kennedy commented that he has been working with Mrs. Connolly and Mr. Evcil on planning to look for expansion. Space is an issue, money is an issue and funding the program is an issue. We did start with Care Plus and it has preventing us from sending students out, we are already having savings by this. Also, with the Preschool program we are creating revenue by not sending students out.

Mrs. VanBuren also asked about buying a new bus and do we have a driver.

Mr. Kennedy responded that we are looking to hire a part time driver and that we are trying to save some money by having the driver do morning run, it allows our big bus for field trips and the two buses for afternoon athletic activities.

Mr. Connors moved, seconded by Mr. Moore a motion for the approval of agenda items 3-19-19-46 and 3-19-19-47. On a roll call vote Mr. Connors, Mrs. Lewis, Mr. McHale, Mrs. Miller, Mr. Moore, Mrs. VanBuren, Ms. Montgomery and Mrs. Kohles voted yes. Motion Carried.
